Camden 13-Dade City 7

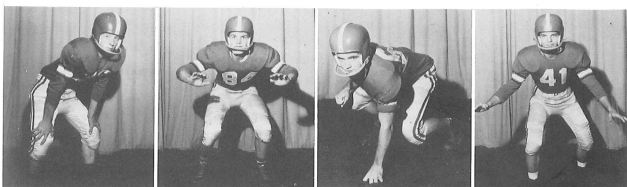

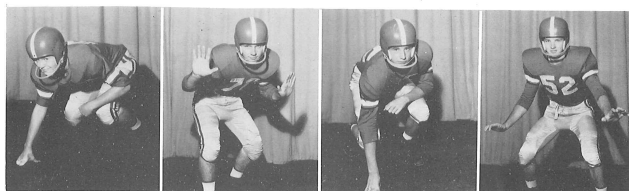

Haines City 12-Dade City 6

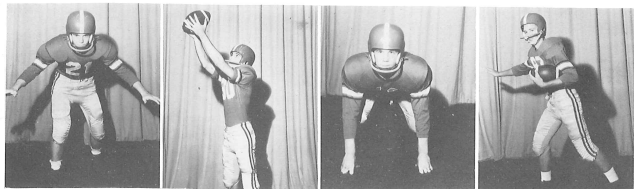
