Mrs. McKillips along with Mr. Kiesling do a fine job as our guidance counselors.

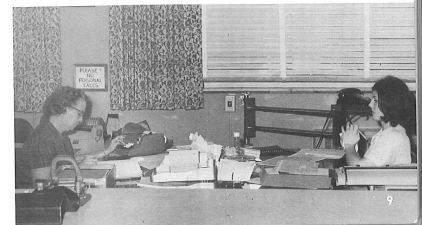


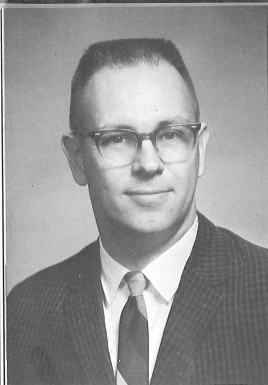

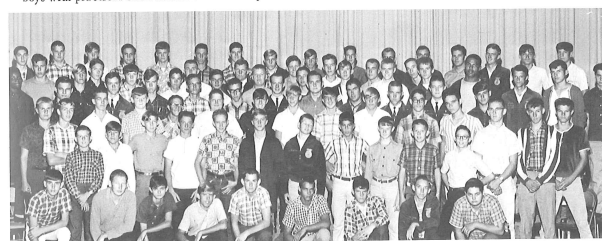


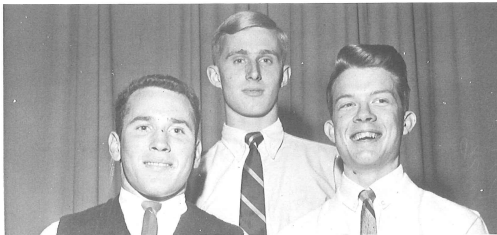
Latin Society

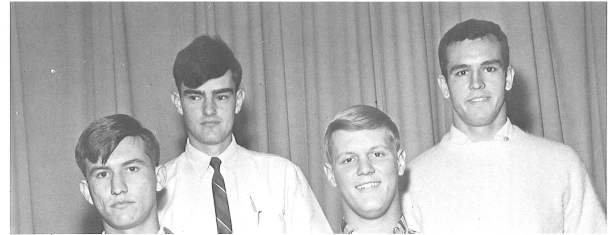

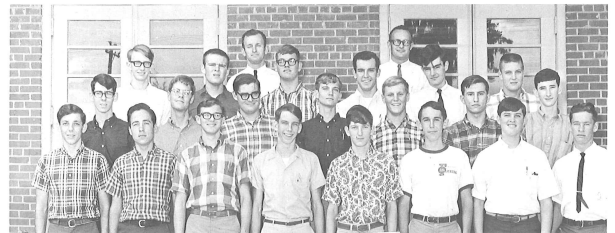
Interact Serves Community

Each thing in its won place will fall.

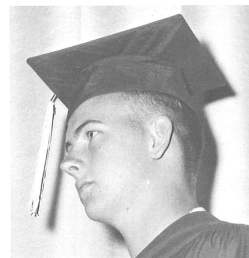
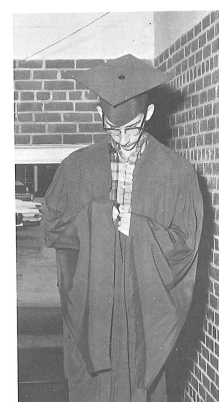
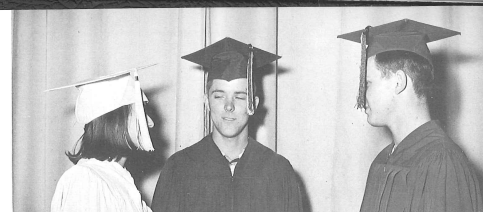
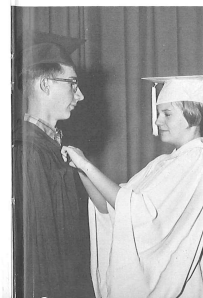
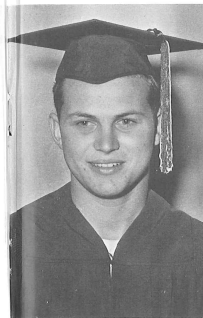
